Singapore, 09 March 2025 – The Association of Information Security Professionals (AiSP) is proud to announce the launch of its inaugural Women Capture the Flag Competition held in conjunction at the International Women Day Celebrations 2025 at the highly anticipated Ladies in Cyber Symposium. This groundbreaking initiative aims to create opportunities for female students and professionals with little to no background in IT, empowering them to build foundational skills and explore careers in technology. Ms Sim Ann, Senior Minister of State, Ministry of Foreign Affairs & Ministry of National Development, will present the prizes for the inaugural Women Capture the Flag Competition as the Guest-of-Honour for the Ladies in Cyber Symposium 2025 and participate in a panel discussion with more than 150 female participants.

Accelerating Action: Empowering Women's Equality in Cybersecurity

The Capture the Flag competition offers participants the chance to engage in real-world cybersecurity scenarios, solving puzzles in areas such as cryptography, network security, and web exploitation. Through guided challenges, participants gain practical skills, from identifying vulnerabilities to simulating attacks and defenses, providing invaluable exposure to cybersecurity tools and techniques in a supportive and collaborative environment.

The Symposium will include a sharing by ST Engineering and a panel discussion with Ms Sim Ann, Senior Minister of State, Ministry of Foreign Affairs & Ministry of National Development and Ms Lata Bavisi, President of EC-Council University. Following the sharing session and panel discussion, attendees will participate in the Friendship Circle, organized in partnership with SG Her Empowerment and NTUC Women and Family. They will be divided into groups of eight, each facilitated by a female facilitator, to discuss tools and resources that could empower them to re-enter the workforce or explore opportunities in the cybersecurity sector. Participants will also share their interests in cybersecurity, the roles or areas that excite them, and ways to stay safe in the digital space.
